

## SUMMER VILLAGE OF NORRIS BEACH

### BYLAW #140

#### A BYLAW OF THE SUMMER VILLAGE OF NORRIS BEACH IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO RESTRICT THE USE OF FERTILIZERS AND HERBICIDES.

**WHEREAS**, Municipal Government Act being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, Part 2, Sections 7 & 8 and amendments thereto, authorizes the Council of a local Municipality to pass a Bylaw regulating the safety, health and welfare of people and the protection of people and property;

**AND WHEREAS** there is a desire for all municipalities around Pigeon Lake to have restrictions on the use of lawn fertilizers;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the Summer Village of Norris Beach, duly assembled, enacts as follows:


1. The use of fertilizers in the Summer Village of Norris Beach is prohibited unless reported to be environmentally approved or of natural compost in nature.
2. All chemical herbicides are prohibited within the Summer Village of Norris Beach except for the control of noxious and prohibited noxious weeds as defined in the Weed Control Act.
3. Contravention of this Bylaw is subject to fines in accordance with Schedule "A" Penalties and Fees, attached hereto and forming part of Bylaw No. 298.
4. This bylaw comes into effect on the date of the third reading.

Read a first time this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2015.

Read a second time this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2015.

Received unanimous consent to proceed to third reading this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2015.

Read a third time and finally passed this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2015.

**Schedule "A": Penalties and Fees  
(Forming part of Norris Beach Bylaw No. 140 – Restrict the Use of  
Fertilizers)**

Any person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable upon summary conviction to a fine of:

Not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$250.00 for a first offence;

Or

Not less than \$250.00 and not more than \$500.00 for subsequent offences.
